<u>CATALOG STATEMENT</u>: This minor is for students, particularly those in various life science, physical science, environmental science, and health science majors, who may wish to pursue employment as an environmental health specialist/sanitarian. Environmental health specialists work in public health departments/districts on a variety of outdoor and indoor environmental health and food inspections (both pre- and post-facility/system installation), conduct health investigations, ensure compliance, and promote environmental health awareness and emergency preparedness. This minor is offered by the College of Agriculture, Health, and Natural Resources.
