Sustainable Community Food Systems MINOR

CATALOG STATEMENT: This minor provides an in-depth exploration of food systems through performing an intensive summer work experience and fall internship (six credits) and reflecting the practice of working in a sustainable community food system. Farm experience working at the Spring Valley Student Farm (or another approved farm or community garden) is required and residence at the farm for at least a summer is encouraged. The minor is offered jointly by the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the College of Agriculture, Health, and Natural Resources.
