Agricultural Learning and Outreach MINOR

CATALOG STATEMENT: The minor in Agricultural Learning and Outreach is only open to students in the College of Agriculture, Health, and Natural Resources. This minor provides the breadth of foundational knowledge needed in professions that involve educating others about a range of agricultural content and issues. This minor requires at least 15 credits of 2000-level or above course work.

NOTE: Completion of this minor does not constitute state teacher certification nor can the courses transfer to a post-baccalaureate teaching program at the University of Connecticut.
