Dairy Management MINOR

CATALOG STATEMENT: This minor provides interested students with an in-depth exposure to all aspects of dairy farm management. Students will have the opportunity to become proficient in animal care and handling, gain knowledge of current dairy technologies and practices and evaluate local dairy farms, with the goal of impacting short and long-term decision-making.

REQUIREMENTS: All students are required to complete 16 credits from the following courses.

- At least 12 credits must not duplicate courses used in the student's major, or in other minors in the College of Agriculture, Health, and Natural Resources.
- Students must earn a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher in each individual course listed above.
- Students must earn a combined grade point average of 2.5 or higher for all courses listed above.
- Students must complete all requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Once the minor has been declared, it will appear on the student's transcript.
